An Act to amend the Legal Practitioners Act

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Legal Practitioners Act, 1879; It is hereby enacted as follows :-

1. To section 3 of the said Act the following shall Addition to be added, namely:—

- "'Tout' means a person who procures the employ- "Tout." ment in any legal business of any legal practitioner in consideration of any remuneration moving from such practitioner, or proposes to a legal practitioner to procure his employment in any legal business in consideration of such remuneration.
- 2. For section 13 of the said Act the following shall be substituted, namely:-

"13. The High Court may also, after such inquiry as it thinks fit, suspend or dismiss any Pleader and dismissal or Mukhtar holding a certificate as aforesaid-

(a) who takes instructions in any case except from the party on whose behalf he is retained, sional or some person who is the recognized agent conduct. of such party within the meaning of the Code of Civil Procedure, or some servant, relative or friend authorized by the party to give such instructions, or

3. For section 22 of the said Act the following shall be substituted, namely:—

"22. The Chief Controlling Revenue-Authority may also, after such inquiry as it thinks fit, suspend or dismiss any Revenue-Agent holding a certificate as aforesaid—

(a) who is guilty of fraudulent or grossly improper conduct in the discharge of his professional duty, or

(b) who tenders, gives or consents to the retention, out of any fee paid or payable to him for his services, of any gratification for procuring or having procured the employment in any legal business of himself or any other Revenue-Agent, or

(c) who, directly or indirectly, procures or attempts to procure the employment of himself as such Revenue-Agent through, or by the intervention of, any person to whom any remuneration for obtaining such employment

- 4. For section 36 of the said Act the following Substitution shall be substituted, namely:-

- "36. (1) Every High Court, District Judge, Power to Sessions Judge, District Magistrate and Presidency frame and publish lies Magistrate, every Revenue-officer, not being below of touts. the rank of a Collector of a District, and the Chief Judge of every Presidency Small Cause Court (each as regards their or his own Court and the Courts, if any, subordinate thereto) may frame and publish lists of persons proved to their or his satisfaction, by evidence of general repute or otherwise, habitually to act as touts, and may, from time to time, alter and amend such lists.
- (2) No person's name shall be included in any such list until he shall have had an opportunity of showing cause against such inclusion.
- (3) A copy of every such list shall be kept hung up in every Court to which the same relates.
- (4) The Court or Judge may, by general or special order, exclude from the precincts of the Court any person whose name is included in any such list.
- (5) Every person whose name is included in any such list shall be deemed to be proclaimed as a tout within the meaning of section 13, clause (e), and section 22, clause (d)."
