An Act to control the withdrawal of capital from the money-market by Companies.

WHEREAS it is expedient owing to the present W war to take power to control the withdrawal of capital from the money-market by Companies; It is hereby enacted as follows:

- 1. (1) This Act may be called the Indian Com- short title and duration. panies Restriction Act, 1918.
- (2) It shall remain in force during the continuance of the present war, and for a period of six months thereafter.
- 2. All words and expressions used in this Act Definitions. and defined in the Indian Companies Act, 1913, shall be deemed to have the meanings respectively attributed to them by that Act.
- 3. (1) Notwithstanding anything in the Indian Prohibition of Companies Act, 1913, the Registrar shall not the registration of, or inregister a company, nor shall a company increase crease of share its share capital, issue debentures, or call up unpaid capital by. capital, unless the company holds a license in this except under behalf issued by the Governor General in Council: license,

Provided that nothing in this sub-section shall apply to a private company.

- (2) A license issued under sub-section (1) shall be subject to such conditions as the Governor General in Council may think fit, and the holder of such license shall comply with any such conditions.
- 4. Any contract made by or on behalf of a contracts made for the company, with the object or the effect of increasing purpose of its share capital, or for the issue of debentures, which share capital is in contravention of the provisions of section 3, in contravenshall be void, and any call made by a company in 3, to be void, contravention of the said provisions shall be unen- and calls to forceable.
